Land and Labor Acknowledgment

We begin this gathering by acknowledging that our shared learning takes place on N'Dakinna, within the Wabanaki Confederacy, which is the unceded traditional homeland of the Abenaki people past and present. We recognize that colonialism and the oppression of Native peoples is a current and ongoing process, and we commit to building our awareness and working to end this oppression. We honor with gratitude the land, the waterways, and the Alnôbak who have stewarded and tended to N'Dakinna throughout the generations, past, present, and future. We also acknowledge the erasure and exclusion of Indigenous cultures in this space: physically, culturally, and ideologically.

We agree with the Vermont Peace and Justice Center, when they "honor the legacy of the African diaspora and the Black lives, knowledge, skills, and labor stolen due to violence and the evolution of white supremacy culture. We acknowledge that much of this country's essential structures would not exist were it not for the free, enslaved, labor of Black people, and that many people of African descent are still being met with violence and killed today for simply existing. [We] honor the legacy of the many other BIPOC ancestors who were victims of the same violent systems that stole their lives, traditions, and families. As the current stewards of this space, it is our collective responsibility to hold these truths of these contributions and losses."

Let us use our spheres of influence as educators and learners to rebuild our understanding of history in a way that centers and honors the lived experience of the Abenaki people and the African diaspora: past, present, and future. Let us strive to critically examine our education, teaching, and schools as well as decolonize our land.

SPECIAL GUEST SPEAKER

Becca Balint

Rep. Becca Balint is a mom, teacher, and progressive leader who comes to Washington ready to fight for working families. Becca is the first woman and openly LGBTQ person to represent her home state of Vermont. As the daughter of working-class, immigrant parents, Becca is deeply committed to defending American democracy and protecting vulnerable communities.

A deep sense of justice, empathy, and service has guided Becca's career from the beginning — first as an educator who taught middle school in Windham County for fourteen years, then as an activist and State Senator, and ultimately as the President Pro Tempore in 2021.

During her eight years in the state senate, she has served on the Economic Development, Housing and General Affairs, Finance, and Rules committees. While Majority Leader, Becca led the passage of the first gun safety laws in the state's history, aimed at keeping Vermont children, communities, and survivors of abuse safe. Becca also worked tirelessly in the state senate to secure the largest housing investment in Vermont in decades to rebuild housing stock and expand middle income housing.

This Congress, Becca will serve as Congressional Progressive Caucus Vice Chair for New Members and as a Co-Chair of the Congressional LGBTQ+ Equality Caucus.

She received her B.A. from Smith College in Northampton, MA, graduating magna cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa. Becca earned her M.Ed. from Harvard University in 1995 and her M.A. in history from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst in 2001.

She is married to noted attorney and opera singer, Elizabeth Wohl. Together, they have two children – Abe, 15, and Sarah, 12 – and an adorable dog named Wheelie. They live in Brattleboro, Vermont.

Both her parents were born and raised in Windham County and their families have deep roots there. Julie and her family moved back to Southern Vermont when she was 3, where she grew up and has lived, except for the three "traditional" semesters spent at UVM in the late '80s. Growing up was spent reading or outdoors, playing in brooks, picking raspberries, and hauling sap for her grandparent's produce and maple farm.

Julie continued to make Southern Vermont her home where she has worked as a bookkeeper, caterer, parade manager, international dairy promoter, and syndicated food columnist. A momentous shift in her life occurred while supporting a family member struggling with mental illness and she realized the huge toll navigating these challenges takes on children and their families. She currently applies her lived experience professionally as the Assistant Program Director at the NFI Vermont Hospital Diversion Program South, supporting youth experiencing acute mental health crises. She values collaboration and connection, is a strong advocate for mental health, and is proud to serve on the board of the Vermont Federation of Families for Children's Mental Health.

She would like to thank her husband, two daughters, wingman Sully the Labrador, and the Women Who Wainscott for all their love and support getting her on this stage today.

Korrina May Cummings

'COLLEGE STEPS' PROGRAM

A Brief History of Northern Vermont University

he roots of Northern Vermont University-Johnson go back to 1828, when John Chesamore, a cobbler, donated his shoe shop to the village of Johnson for an elementary and secondary school. Dr. Carpenter, a preacher from Chelsea, Vermont, became the first schoolmaster, and the new school was chartered in 1832 by the state as "Johnson Academy." The first class comprised just sixteen students.

In 1836, five communities incorporated as the Lamoille County Grammar School Association to support the school. In 1866, when the state created three "normal schools" (schools created to establish teaching standards, or norms, and train high school graduates to become teachers), the school's focus changed from general community education to teacher training. The Johnson Normal School offered one-, two-, and three-year training programs for teachers until 1947, when the state added a four-year program. At that time the school became "Johnson Teachers College."

By an act of the 1961 Legislature, the Vermont State Colleges Board of Trustees was created to oversee the state college system. This new board assumed control from the State Board of Education on July 1, 1962, and the institution became "Johnson State College." This new name signaled a change in the college from a single-purpose, teacher-training college to a multipurpose, liberal arts school.

On July 1, 2018, Johnson State College and Lyndon State College unified to become Northern Vermont University, a two-campus institution of higher learning. Each campus retains its rich history and identity, as well as its athletics teams – the Johnson Badgers and Lyndon Hornets – but the collaboration and student opportunities now expand across two vibrant campuses located in Vermont's northern tier.

On July 1, 2023, Northern Vermont University will join with Castleton University and Vermont Technical College to become Vermont State University, a reimagined higher education institution building on the strong legacies of its founding institutions. Vermont State University will bring the best of our institutions together, with campuses at Johnson, Lyndon, Castleton, Randolph, and Williston and learning sites and modalities throughout the state and beyond.

The Traditions of Commencement

THE CHESAMORE BELL

The Chesamore Bell is from Chesamore Hall, the original site of what is today Northern Vermont University's Johnson Campus. For more than 110 years, the tolling of the bell called students to pursue their studies. In 1995, the bell was brought out of retirement to ring in the new academic year at Opening Convocation. The tradition continues today as we ring the bell again to honor this year's graduating class.

THE MACE

The role of mace bearer is ceremonial and derives from medieval times. In England since the sixteenth century and in America since colonial days, it has been a symbol of office. In commencement ceremonies, the mace is borne by a distinguished member of the faculty.

FLAGS

The flags that appear in the Commencement ceremony represent the nations and states of this year's graduating class. Students in the Class of 2023 hail from:

United States, Canada, Jamaica, Japan, Uganda, Uruguay, Zimbabwe, Alaska, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Hawaii, Indiana, Massachusetts, Maryland, Maine, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia, Vermont, Washington, Wisconsin, and Wyoming.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The cap, gown, and colorful hood so prominent in commencement ceremonies resemble to some extent articles of dress worn by church and university dignitaries in the Middle Ages. The cap and gown indicate that the wearer is a member of a university or college. The hood shows the degree the wearer holds.

The gown for the bachelor's degree has pointed sleeves and is designed to be worn closed. The master's gown has closed sleeves that are square at the end, with the arms coming through a slit at the elbow. It may be worn either open or closed. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves and may be worn open or closed. It also has a facing of velvet down the front and three bars of the same material on each sleeve. The facing and bars may be either black or the color distinctive of the discipline to which the degree pertains. The cap is worn for all degrees; the doctor may wear a golden tassel.

Hoods are normally black with a colorful lining rolled outward. Master's hoods are 3½ feet; doctorate hoods are 4 feet. The silk or satin lining of the hood is the color (or colors) of the university or college that conferred the degree. Some have a sash or chevron of a contrasting color. The colors of trim, hood edges, and cap tassels often represent the academic discipline(s) studied, also known as "academic regalia intercollegiate colors."

Today, both our graduate and undergraduate students wear the colors of their discipline(s) of study — graduates through the master's hood, and undergraduates through a braided cord.

Rainbow Cords: These cords are worn in recognition of the special challenges that students from the LGBTQ+ community face on their path to graduation. This cord acknowledges, celebrates, and affirms the achievements of graduates who identify as LGBTQ+.

Green and Blue Cords: Northern Vermont University recognizes and celebrates the commitment and achievements of student-athletes, interns, and managers who have contributed to the success of the NVU-Johnson Athletics and Recreation Program.
